

WILLIAMS WINS FOUNDATION (WINS)

Williams WINS Foundation was established in 2005 to be the financial support means for special programs here at Williams. Williams WINS Foundation is dedicated to raising funds to improve and enhance the quality and variety of experiences for Williams Elementary students. Donations enable our teachers, staff and parent volunteers to continue to create a solid foundation for our children's education.

It is Wins vision to fundraise at a level that will allow us to support our current and future programs that are not funded by our school district.

WINS supports programs *for every student at every grade level*. The biggest expense covered by Williams Wins are the Williams specialist contracts. Williams is very fortunate to have specialists working with our children in the area of Art, Science, and Noon League. Financial resources are generated through a variety of programs such as: Donations, Special Events, and Grants.

SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL (SSC)

This is a decision-making group of parents, community people and school staff members in schools receiving funding for a School Improvement Program. The SSC reviews the budget annually, establishes a new budget and makes modifications as necessary. Members are elected by their peers, i.e., classroom teachers by classroom teachers, parents by parents. Positions on the School Site Council require a two-year commitment.

The California Education Code requires the School Site Council to develop a Single Plan for Student Achievement for Consolidated Application programs operated at the school. The council must recommend the proposed plan to the local governing board for approval, monitor its implementation, and evaluate the results. At least annually, the council must revise and recommend the plan, including proposed expenditures of all funds allocated to the school through the Consolidated Application, to the local governing board for approval.

CULTURAL CABINET

Established in 2007, the Cultural Cabinet currently consists of representatives from Assyrian, Chinese, Indian, Iranian, Japanese, and Korean communities of our school. Cabinet members meet monthly with the principal and representatives from Williams WINS Foundation and School Site Council to be informed of events, news and needs of the school. These representatives serve as school ambassadors to their individual communities and also advise the administration of issues affecting their particular cultures. Input from all cultures is welcome. If your culture is not currently represented and you would like to become involved, please contact the principal.

The Walk 4 Williams Event takes place in the fall. This event is for everyone in the Williams Community and a great way to raise money while having fun! BAKE SALES

This committee is responsible for 2-3 Bake Sales held in the fall and in the spring. Team members coordinate the donation of baked goods. Goods are wrapped up and presented for sale at the school.

Chairperson: The chairperson works with the principal to set the bake sale days during the calendar year. The chairperson will also coordinate committee members to help receive goods and manage day of sales.

Committee Members: The committee will assist the chairperson in collecting baked goods and helping with sales on the bake sale days.

FAMILY FUNDRAISING NIGHTS

Chairs organize family nights out (restaurants) throughout the school year, the objective being to have fun with others in the Williams community and make money for WINS. The restaurants donate a percentage of the proceeds to Williams WINS.

CRAB & PASTA FEED AND AUCTION

This team manages our annual crab and pasta feed during late January/beginning of February. Located at an off campus venue, this team coordinates crab purchase, facility logistics, raffle donations, dessert donations, decorations, manages an auctioneer, and coordinates a large number of volunteers needed to make the event a success.

Chairperson: Oversees the entire crab & pasta feed and manages team leaders.

Committee Members: Members coordinate food, beverages, decorations, volunteers, logistics, auctioneer, etc. The Silent and Live Auction committee is also part of this team.

AUCTION

This team is responsible for auction items that will be needed during our Annual Crab Feed. Auction team members will work on the following items for our Live and Silent Auction:

Check-Out

Chairperson: This person will coordinate the overall auction needs and will be a member of the Crab Feed Committee

Committee Members: Committee members will work with the chairman to meet all of the Live and Silent Auction needs. This group will also coordinate year-round donations for the auction.

SCRIP (PAPER)

Coordinate this gift card program as a fundraiser for the school. Williams earns money for each gift card purchased. Create fliers and advertise the program through the Wednesday envelope and online.

FREE FUNDRAISING 4 WILLIAMS

1. BOX TOPS FOR EDUCATION / LUCKY SHARES

The Box Tops for Education program is sponsored by General Mills. Parents cut off the special box tops from various cereals and other products. Each classroom collects these box tops and the school receives monetary awards based on how many we collected.

The Lucky Shares program involves getting Shares cards from the store for parents to use while shopping at Lucky stores. Each time the card is used a portion of the money spent is donated back to Williams.

2. ESCRIP

Work with Wins Board members to promote this no-cost way to donate through shopping programs. Williams families register their Safeway, Macys, etc. cards on www.escrip.com and Williams will earn a percentage of the purchases. The coordinator will also manage the enrollment process and educate the parent community.

3. AMAZON

Williams will earn a percentage of the purchases people make through Amazon when they use the Williams code.

4. OFFICE DEPOT

Williams will earn a percentage of the purchases people make through Office Depot when they use the Williams code.

5. FRENCH TOAST/LANSEND

Williams will earn a percentage of the purchases people make through French Toast and LandsEnd when they use the Williams code.

Chairpersons: Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 25 hours. This person educates parents and students about the programs, collects the box tops from the classrooms and follows company procedures for collecting rewards. This person will also work with Lucky to collect and distribute the Shares cards.

SPLASHED BY A WHALE

This team oversees a WINS fundraiser where plastic whales are “splashed” in front of a home or office to celebrate a special occasion. Splashed by a Whale is usually in celebrating of birthdays, graduation or other special occasions.

Chairperson: Stores whales and sticks, marketing for fundraiser and oversees group to help with splashing.

Committee Members: Alternate months where they will be responsible for setting up and taking down the whales.

Community Building

UNIFORM WEAR & SHARE EXCHANGE

School uniforms are donated to the school throughout the year. This team will coordinate the Wear & Share program at key events in the fall and spring. This is a free program, no money exchanged! This gives parents the opportunity to pick up gently used clothing for free.

Chairperson: August/May, On Campus, Time Commitment: 12 hours

Works with WINS to establish the date and time for events. Usually takes place at Ice Cream Social, Back to School Night, Open House and Carnival. Organizes committee members to sort clothing and run event.

Committee Member: August/May, On Campus, Time Commitment: 5 hours
Assists Chairperson sorting and folding uniforms, and running the event.

ICE CREAM SOCIAL

This is a social get-together that occurs at the beginning of the school year.

Chairperson: August, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 10 hours

Obtains ice cream and other supplies

Coordinates volunteers to scoop the ice cream, set up and clean up.

Committee Members: August, On Campus, Time Commitment: 5 hours

Helps scoop ice cream, set up and clean up.

JACK O LANTERN JAM

This is a pumpkin carving event that occurs before Halloween at Williams. It is a fun, community event that includes special t-shirts that the students may wear during the month of October.

Chairperson: Fall, on/off campus, Time Commitment: 10-15 hours.

Obtains pumpkins and other supplies, coordinates volunteers and the event.

Committee Members: Fall, on campus, Time Commitment: 2-5 hours.

Work event, help with set up and clean up.

A SPLASH OF ART AND MUSIC / SPRING MOVIE NIGHT

This special event combines the beautiful art of our students with their talents as musicians for a wonderful evening. The show is held on campus in the early evening and then a movie is showcased later. Food is available for purchase.

Chairperson: February - May, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 10 hours

Obtains food and other supplies

Coordinates volunteers to work on art set up, works with Music Docent on show, set up and clean up

Committee Members: February - May, On Campus, Time Commitment 5 hours

Helps set up art, coordinate food, set up and clean up.

HERITAGE DAY

This multi-cultural event is an evening showcasing the various cultures represented by our diverse student body. Parents demonstrate their heritage through clothing displays, food samples, artwork, etc. Students showcase their heritage through performances like dance, music recital, song, and poetry.

Chairperson: Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 30-40 hours

Recruit committee members and the culture leads to organize overall event.

Committee Members: Year round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 10 hours

Assist Chairperson in coordinating the event.

Culture Leads: Recruit parent volunteers to lead the representation of the culture with other parent/student volunteers for performances and booth presentations.

END OF THE YEAR CARNIVAL

Shortly before the end of the school year, an evening Carnival occurs on campus. A catering service provides the meal, a carnival vendor supplies the games, while entertainment is enjoyed by all.

Chairperson: Spring, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 15 hours

Schedules dinner and activities for the children

Sells and distributes dinner tickets

Buys prizes, set-up and manages the prize room

Coordinates volunteers

Committee Members: Spring, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 8 hours

Assists chairperson with various tasks

Outreach Events

2nd HARVEST: Picks up barrels from 2nd Harvest, puts them out at the school in November and advertises to the school to donate canned food. Donates the food to 2nd Harvest

GIVING TREE: Puts up a tree end of November in the office with tags for the community to donate items.

KID'S HOLIDAY BOUTIQUE: Coordinates items for students to buy during the holiday season, sets-up items, sells them, and cleans up event. Proceeds go towards Williams' families in need.

Committee Member: Helps the Chairperson set-up the items, sell them and clean up the event.

Parent Programs

LOVE AND LOGIC PARENTING CLASSES

This person coordinates the Love and Logic Parenting Classes that happen once a month. Classes are normally held in the morning.

SCHOOL SUPPLY KITS

In the spring, this chairperson works with the Williams staff and an outside vendor to provide parents with the option to purchase pre-packaged school supply kits for the following school year.

Chairperson: Spring and August, Off/On Campus, Time Commitment: 10-15 hours

Serve as the liaison between the William WINS and the school supply vendor. In the spring, manage the vendor contract, oversee the distribution of flyers, and be the contact person for any parent or teacher questions. In August, be responsible for ensuring that the kits contain the requested supplies and that all ordered kits are received. Coordinate the distribution of kits to the classrooms prior to the first day of school.

Committee Member: Spring and August, On Campus

Assist with copying and distributing flyers in the spring. Assist with checking and distributing kits in August.

Student Programs

POPCORN CLUB

Committee members provide Popcorn for the Principal's Reward Club, which is used as special recognition rewards for the children.

Chairperson: Year Round, Off Campus, time Commitment: 20 hours

Coordinates parents to provide Popcorn on a regular basis

Committee Members: Year Round, Off Campus, time Commitment: 1 hour per session.

Pop and bag Popcorn as assigned and send to office

PICTURE DAY, HEARING TESTS, ETC.

Throughout the year, volunteer help is needed to support events such as picture day, hearing tests and the book faire.

Chairperson: Year Round, On/Off Campus, time Commitment: 15 hours

Coordinate volunteer support for events

Committee Members: Year Round, On Campus, Time Commitment 6-10 hours

Assist on the day of the event, as directed by the chairperson

Staff Programs

STAFF APPRECIATION

This committee provides food and beverage for Teacher and Staff Appreciation lunches. A great way to get to know our teachers!

Chairperson: Year Round On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: Varies

Coordinate Luncheons for the Teachers and Staff

Committee: Year round, On/Off campus. Time commitment: Varies

Help set up, obtain and clean up food and beverages at scheduled events.

Welcome Wagon

INCOMING KINDER SUMMER PARK DAYS

This person coordinates summer park days for incoming kinders. This will help kinder parents and students get to know one another before the school year begins.

KINDER WELCOME BBQ

A welcome BBQ for the new kinders takes place in the fall. This is a nice way for incoming Williams families to get to know one another.

Committee Chair: Fall. Time Commitment: 10 hours

Buys/orders food, supplies for the bbq, name tags, etc. set-up, games, clean-up and manages volunteers. Coordinates tables with the custodian, decorations and manages event.

BUDDY PROGRAM

Pair new students up with a buddy from the same class. The buddy will help the new student adjust to life at Williams.

Chairperson: Year round, On Campus, Time Commitment: Varies

This person will be in charge of pairing up new students with a buddy from the same class.

Curriculum Enrichment

ART VISTA

The Williams Art Vista curriculum is dedicated to exposing our students to some of the great artists. Each grade level is presented with either 3 or 4 famous artists over the school year. There is a brief biographical presentation followed by a hands-on art project inspired in some way by the profiled artist. All the materials are provided. The presentations and art project require about 1½ hours, which the volunteer schedules with the teacher. Having two volunteers per class is ideal. The students are exposed to the five key elements of art, as well as learning to distinguish between famous artists and painting styles. At the end of the year there is an art show event – A Splash of Art and Music. This art show displays the wonderful, creative works the students accomplish through the Art Vista Program.

Chairperson: Year round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 60 hours

Familiarizing self with framework for the various grade levels

Select prints, Research background of artist

Design follow-up classroom lesson*

Recruit members for the committee

Provide prints and lesson plans for docents to use

*The first four duties are largely in place

Committee Members: Year round, on campus, Time Commitment: 12-15 hours

Present three or four lessons to a class on a famous artist

FOURTH GRADE FUNDRAISING FOR FIFTH GRADE SCIENCE CAMP

This group will oversee the fundraising efforts of the Fourth Graders as they work to earn money to attend Fifth Grade Science Camp. Fundraising in the past has included selling sodas at the End of Year Carnival, and selling items during other school events.

GREEN TEAM RECYCLING

This team collects recyclables once a month and coordinates having them deposited to earn money for the school. The team can also work to create more recycling opportunities on campus.

CONCERT CHOIR

The Concert Choir is formed for the purpose of raising fund (\$50/student) and performing at the Winter Wonderland of Music.

The job entails forming and organizing the choir (grade 1 to 5), selecting songs for the program, practicing with them 6 to 8 sessions (after school) and conducting the choir at the Fund raising concert.

FIFTH GRADE SCIENCE FAIR

This committee coordinates the Fifth Grade Science Fair. Committee members include Science Fair Coordination, Mentor in the classroom, Science Fair Day Volunteers. Non-5th grade parents are also needed as judges for the fair.

Chairperson: Fall, On Campus, Time Commitment: Varies
Work with the Fifth Grade Teachers to coordinate the Science Fair.
Committee Member: Helps create and organize this event.

JUNIOR GREAT BOOKS

Volunteers are trained as leaders to facilitate discussion groups that will help students make connections between their ideas, experiences, and literature. In the discussion group, students read and share their ideas and opinions about a story in a small group. Students in the program develop good reading habits as they reflect on the ideas they encounter in the stories and discussion. You will be invited to attend a workshop, which will help guide you in what you need to know to begin working with the students.

Chairperson: Year round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: Varies
Coordinates volunteers and training and helps committee members facilitate the program.
Committee: Year Round, On Campus, Time Commitment: Varies
Work with teachers and other parents to bring this established program to the students.

MUSIC DOCENT

The Williams Music Docent program exposes our students to the world of music. The program emphasizes music appreciation and may include singing and using musical instruments. The Music Docent parent volunteer is able to choose the lessons he or she would like to present to the class. Volunteers schedule a 1-hour lesson time with the teacher. Musical ability is not required...only music enthusiasm. All training and materials are provided.

Chairperson(s): Year round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 60 hours

Familiarizing self with program for the various grade levels

Recruit members for the committee

Provide resources, ideas and materials for the docents to use.

Committee Members: Year round, On Campus, Time Commitment: 12-15 hours

Present three or four music lessons to a class. More classes may be presented depending on the docent's and the teacher's schedules.

PROJECT CORNERSTONE:

Project Cornerstone (www.projectcornerstone.org) is a Santa Clara County-wide collaborative of community leaders and numerous partner organizations working together to provide all children and youth with the support, opportunities and boundaries they need to thrive and be successful contributors to society. Decades of research conducted by the Search Institute (www.search-institute.org) identified 40 essential building blocks that are the cornerstone of healthy development. These building blocks, also known as developmental assets, are the experiences, values, relationships and opportunities that all children and youth need to succeed. To better serve our multi cultural community in Santa Clara County, Project Cornerstone added a 41st asset, cultural diversity.

In schools, Project Cornerstone enables caring adult role models to assist in building these developmental assets.

At Williams two literacy-based programs, Chinese Cultural Project and the ABC Program, are used to assist in developing the 41 assets. These programs are staffed with volunteers in each classroom to teach developed lesson plans.

Chinese Cultural Project: Uses selected Chinese literature with a moral and/or educational lesson to expand students' knowledge of the Chinese culture and traditions.

Chairperson: Year Round, On Campus: Time Commitment 4 hours per month.

Classroom Volunteers (1/classroom): Attend one 30 minute training session per month.

Present one 20 minute lesson per month. Time Commitment: 10 hours.

ABC (Asset Building Champion) Program: Utilizes English literature with a moral and/or educational lesson to provide students with relationship skills and interpersonal competence.

Chairperson: Year Round, On/Off Campus: Time Commitment 5 hours per month.

Classroom Volunteers (1/classroom): Attend 20 minute training session per month. Present one 45 minute lesson plan per month. Time Commitment: 12 hours.

Administration

WEBMASTER

Williams needs a webmaster! This person will be responsible for creating and maintaining our community pages. This person can also assist with the on-line directory, Splashed by a Whale, on-line event forms, etc. This person can also assist with the Website Calendar.

YAHOO GROUP MODERATOR

The Williams Yahoo Group is a great way for Williams Parents to exchange information with each other. Parents wanting to be added to the Yahoo group must send an e-mail to the administrator. Act as Account Administrator, adding and deleting members upon request and approving content.

ALMADEN TIMES EDITOR

This volunteer will work with the editor of the Almaden Times to publicize Williams activities. The volunteer would need to contact both publications, receive their editorial requirements and track each publication's deadlines for the school year. The volunteer would also be the on-site contact at the event.

GRAPHIC DESIGNER

We need a graphic designer who can help create event flyers, banners, posters, order forms, etc. The school is in the process of purchasing a color printer that can be used for this position.

PAY PAL COORDINATOR

This person will coordinate PayPal utilization during events.

DIRECTORY

Each fall Williams publishes a directory of names and phone numbers of students by classroom (whose parents have given their consent). This is a reference to use for calling classroom friends, obtaining homework, etc.

Chairperson: September & October, Off Campus, Time Commitment: 40 hours

Committee Member: September & October, Off Campus, Time Commitment: 20 hours. Committee members may provide input and solicit advertising.

E-SPLASH NEWSLETTER EDITOR

The editor of the E-Splash works with the principal to set the publishing dates throughout the school year. The principal will send all the content to the editor and the editor will format the on-line newsletter in a timely fashion. The E-Splash typically goes out twice a month.

MARKETING COORDINATOR

This person coordinates social media marketing for Williams. This will include a moderator for a Facebook page as well as other marketing duties.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

This team organizes the Earthquake Preparedness Program working closely with the principal.

Chairperson: September, On Campus, Time Commitment: 15 hours
Communicate with each teacher to verify student survival packets and water.

YEARBOOK

The Yearbook is a pictorial memory of the school year. It is sold in the fall, with distribution during the last week of the school year.

Chairperson:
Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 85 hours. Take yearbook layout training, coordinate sale and distribution of the yearbook, layout all pages and submit camera-ready copy for printing.

Committee Member: Assists Chairperson in taking photographs and page layout.

LOST AND FOUND

This position involves a weekly clean-up of lost student items. This person works with office to provide clothing needed by health office and periodically donates unclaimed items.

Volunteer Operation Team

I-VOLUNTEER ONLINE COORDINATOR

This person will oversee the iVolunteer program on-line and educate room parents on how to utilize the program. The coordinator will also moderate the system.

FLEX FORCE

This group of volunteers can be available when we have areas that need general assistance at the school. Duties can include helping with copying, assistance with Picture Day, etc.

Chairperson: The chairperson will maintain a list of volunteers who can be called to jump in when needed to help with various jobs on campus.

Committee Members: A group of people who are willing to fill the volunteer holes when needed at the school.

BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE

This group of parents maintains the landscaping around the campus. Watering, weeding and trimming are done on an on-going basis. There are two or three weekend work parties that are set aside for major projects. This is a good opportunity to fulfill hours during the weekend or evenings.

Chairperson: Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment 80+ hours

Coordinate projects, volunteers and funding

May work with the City of San Jose for grants

Committee Members: Year Round, On Campus, Time Commitment 1-40 hours. Assist with on-going maintenance of trees, bushes, flowerbeds and all other campus needs.

DAD'S CLUB

New for 2010-2011! This will be a group of Dads who can be coordinated to help with a variety of events throughout the school year. In addition, this is a great way for the Dads of Williams to get to know one another while getting involved in the school.

Chairperson: The chairperson will get this group going and manage the group with activities and volunteer coordination throughout the year.

KINDER ASSESSMENT WITH SEED PLANTING

Coordinate volunteers to greet incoming kinders and their parents. Volunteers hand out appropriate paperwork and, once the assessment is complete, help the kinders plant a seed to take home.

School Assistance

TRANSLATORS:

These volunteers work with the teachers and staff, as required, to help translate lessons, newsletters, make telephone calls, etc.

Committee Members: Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: Varies

Translate materials into various languages.

COPYING

We need a few parents that can help copying materials for the office. This includes assistance with copying 50 in a minute forms used by all grades throughout the year.

BOOK FAIRE

This team works with the teacher coordinator in bringing Scholastic Books to our school in two book fairs that take place on the at Williams campus.

Chairperson: Fall and Spring. On Campus, Time Commitment: About 10 hours

Coordinates with committee members and media center specialist in ordering, receiving, and setting up fair. Other duties include collection of money from students for books.

Committee Members: Fall and Spring, On Campus, Time Commitment: 1-3 hours

This team assists Chairperson in all tasks relating to book fair.

CLASSROOM HELPER

Under the direction of the classroom teacher, parents assist in many ways. Parents, guardians and grandparent helpers will have training using school machinery. PLEASE INFORM YOUR TEACHER DIRECTLY IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO HELP IN THE CLASSROOM!

As a vital part of Williams, this committee will provide support in the Media Center. Please inform your teacher directly if you are interested in this position.

Committee Members: Year Round, On/Off Campus, Time Commitment: 4-10 hours/month

Assist with book checkout and re-shelving

Bar codes and enters new books into computer system

Assist with end-of-year inventory

POSITIVE PLAYGROUND SUPPORT TEAM

Volunteers are essential to the success of these programs. There are three different areas where volunteers are needed to help with the children.

All Positions: Year Round, On Campus, Time Commitment: Varies

YARD DUTY

The safety of our Williams students at lunch is critical! This volunteer area is likely one of the most important areas in our volunteer program. It requires consistency, understanding, confidentiality and patience. We desire our yard to be active and fun, but our duty to our students means SAFETY COMES FIRST! Noon league takes some of the stress off the playground, but we need a committed group of parents to actively and consistently supervise the other areas of the yard.

NOON LEAGUE

The Noon League program is a group of organized activities run during the lunch hour for students of all grade levels. Activities range from sports, to a game corner, lip-sync area, kidsercise (20 minute exercise program) and more. Cooperative play is encouraged as well as positive teamwork. Students interact within their own grade level in the sports activities and with all grade levels at the activity corners.
